

A Time of Remembrance

Reggie McNeal's introductory words in his book "Practicing Greatness" captured my attention immediately. His subject dealt with the need for great spiritual leaders. This is what he said:

"Deliberate mediocrity is a sin." I can still recall the moment I heard Elton Trueblood speak those opening words in chapel at the seminary I attended over three decades ago. Despite his quiet Quaker spirit and diminutive presence, Trueblood roared a challenge that caused my spirit immediately to leap, as if suddenly shot with adrenaline. Years later I am still as thrilled and motivated by them as when I first heard them. They were--and still are--words of liberation for me.

The Apostle Paul's words recorded centuries earlier are the foundation for such a mindset. He wrote "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God" (I Cor 10:31 TNIV).

I've heard stories about those who were so active and supportive of this congregation, who have been called on into the glory of heaven. The longer I stay, the more familiar I am with some of those who leave their physical body to enter the eternal rest promised to all of us who know Christ Jesus as Lord. Even with the assurance of heaven, sometimes the loss and departure can be very difficult to bear.

Memorial Day weekend is coming up, and with that holiday comes the reminder of those men and women who served our country faithfully and well. They gave the ultimate sacrifice of their lives so we might enjoy the freedoms that come as citizens of this great country.

In concert with this emphasis, **we are going to have "A Time of Remembrance" during the May 30th worship service.** I will read the names of the members of our family of faith who died between Memorial Day 2009 and Memorial Day 2010. We will pause and give thanks for their lives and the way they touched each one of us. I hope many of you can be here to take part.

Also, I want to thank Marvin for his leadership with the Music Ministry Recognition Service on the 19th. We are blessed with devoted workers, children and youth, and it meant a great deal to be in the Chapel for this occasion. We have much to be grateful for with our music ministry.

"Deliberate mediocrity" is not our goal. Let us get into a pattern of determining what God has given us to work with rather than what we don't have. May we join together in giving God our very best so that Christ might be exalted through University Heights Baptist Church. There's still much to do, and we can all have a part.
